**RE-ZONING UPDATE - Andrea Steinkamp**

- All current PS199 students will remain PS199 students.
- Siblings of current PS199 students will continue to have enrollment priority, as outlined in the Chancellor's Regulations
- Why is Re-Zoning Proposed Across District 3?
  - Ease overcrowding (particularly relevant to PS199)
  - Right-size enrollment and balance capacity
  - Promote diversity
  - Ensure successful schools
- Key Overcrowding Statistics for PS199
  - Current enrollment is 887, on a DOE published building capacity of 642
  - Continued K admittance levels consistent with 2015/2016 (6 classes) will result in the loss of cluster classrooms used for science, art, music, and movement classes.
- North of 72nd street is an historical preservation district, so a lot of new development is happening south of 72nd.
- A list of re-sitings and a map of proposed zone lines were presented.
- The PTA has never advocated for a specific proposal, however the PTA has always supported some kind of change to ease overcrowding at PS199.
- The CEC will vote on November 22nd.
- Question about how many PS452 students would be eligible to come to PS199 in the upper grades based on the proposed zone line changes above 70th street and west of Broadway. Hard to determine, however, the number of upper grade students who would be removed from the PS199 zone through redrawing the zone lines is likely similar to the number who could come from PS452.
- Question about how long it would take for the new zone lines and the 5 kindergarten sections we have been promised (as opposed to the 6 we have had for several years) to have an impact on overcrowding. It's complicated because of a reduction in recent years to the attrition in upper grades, however every year will make a difference.
- Question about the increasing the district capacity for middle school and high school. An ongoing important conversation
